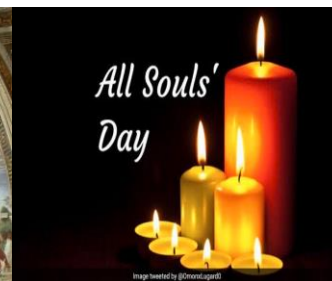
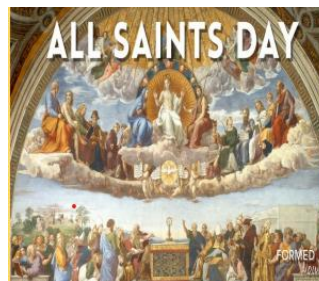

All Saints' Day – November 1, 2021

What is the difference between All Saints and All Souls Day? In the Catholic Church, “the faithful” refers specifically to baptized Catholics; “all souls” commemorates the church penitent of souls in purgatory, whereas “all saints” commemorates the church triumphant of saints in Heaven. On this day in particular, Catholics pray for the dead.

All Souls' Day – November 2, 2021

In places where All Saints' Day is observed as public holiday but All Souls' Day is not, cemetery and grave rituals such as offerings of flowers, candles, and prayers or blessings for the graves of loved ones often take place on All Saints Day.

The Christian celebration of All Saints' Day and All Souls' Day stems from a belief that there is a powerful spiritual bond between those in heaven (the “Church triumphant”), and the living (the “Church militant”). In Catholic theology, the day commemorates all those who have attained the beatific vision in Heaven.
