A Triduum at Precious Blood Church in honor of **St. Pio of Pietrelcina** on Tuesday - Thursday Sept 20-22, 2022 @ 6pm.

Feast Day -Friday, September 23, 2022



Francesco Forgione, OFM Cap., better known as Padre Pio and also Saint Pius of Pietrelcina (born May 25, 1887, Pietrelcina, Italy - died September 23, 1968, San Giovanni Rotondo; canonized June 16, 2002; feast day September 23), Born into a devout Roman Catholic family,

he consecrated himself to Jesus at age 5. He was an Italian Franciscan Capuchin friar, priest, stigmatist, and mystic. He is venerated as a saint in the Catholic Church. As a humble Capuchin priest, he was the recipient of some of the most astonishing spiritual gifts: the stigmata, bilocation, healing, prophecy, and the ability to read souls. Pio suffered from several illnesses most of his life and bled daily from stigmata wounds for 50 years, according to his biography by the Saint Pio Foundation. Undeniably the most famous of the miracles associated with Padre Pio was his stigmata; he bore the wounds of Christ in his hands, feet and side. With the possible exception of St. Paul (see Gal. 6:17), he was the first priest in history to bear the stigmata.
